

# Humber, Coast and Vale Health and Care Partnership

## Update Report

June 2018

The following report highlights recent work of the Humber, Coast and Vale Health and Care Partnership across some of our key priority areas. ### **Strategic Resourcing Boards**

In order to support our transformation programmes, a number of strategic boards have been established across the Humber, Coast and Vale Health and Care Partnership working on key strategic agendas: workforce, capital and estates, finance and digital technology.

#### ***Capital and Estates Board***

The Capital and Estates Board is continuing to work through the process of developing a regional estates strategy, which will help us to identify where capital investment is required in order for us to deliver transformation and improvements to local services as described in our local and Partnership-wide plans. The Board is working to the July deadline for completion of this strategy document, and the capital investment plan that will underpin it, as required by the national process. The Humber, Coast and Vale Executive Group has agreed to support a series of thematic, system-wide investment plans that focus on areas where further capital investment is required in order to support transformation and local service improvement, particularly in our clinical priority areas. Over the coming weeks, we will be working together across the Partnership to finalise our capital investment plan, which will be presented to Executive Group at its meeting in July. We are working hard as a Partnership to ensure we put forward the best possible plan in order to secure much-needed capital investment into our local health and care system.

#### ***Digital Board***

The Strategic Digital Board, chaired by Chris Long (Chief Executive, Hull and East Yorkshire Hospitals NHS Trust), will meet on Friday 15<sup>th</sup> June. The Board will discuss the development of a digital strategy for the health and care system in Humber, Coast and Vale and the future workplan for the board, looking at important developments such as access and digital healthcare, big data and population health management and digital infrastructure and supporting collaboration. The Board is still recruiting for a citizen member to join ([more information about how to apply is available on our website](#)).

One of our key partnership ambitions, which the digital board will consider, is to improve the way in which we share information across our diverse health and social care economy to ensure patients and the health professionals who treat them can access the necessary information about their care when and where they need it. This is why we are working with West Yorkshire



and Harrogate and South Yorkshire and Bassetlaw Health and Care Partnerships on a joint Yorkshire and Humber-wide bid to become a Local Health and Care Record Exemplar (LHCRE). This will enable us to put in place effective systems for the sharing of records across health and care organisations across the whole region and beyond.

Earlier this month, three regions were named as being successful in the first round of LHCRE bids. Although we are not amongst the first regions named, we are still in a strong position having been asked by NHS England to provide more evidence and detail for some parts of our original submission. The leaders of the three Yorkshire and Humber Health and Care Partnerships today restated their support for the bid and provided the requested information to NHS England to support the joint work in this area.

### ***Strategic Workforce Board***

Following a successful Workforce Partnership Forum that was held on 25<sup>th</sup> April 2018, the Partnership would like to build on the enthusiasm and momentum generated to support the development of the Humber, Coast and Vale Workforce Delivery Plan. To support the development of the delivery plan, the Strategic Workforce Board is hosting two workshop sessions over the coming weeks. ### **Supporting Transformation – working with the Yorkshire and the Humber Academic Health Science Networks (Y&H AHSN)**

The Partnership Executive Group received a presentation from Mike Potts, Associate at Yorkshire and Humber Academic Health Science Networks (Y&H AHSN), which highlighted some of the potential benefits for the Partnership of working more closely with the AHSN to support innovation and improvement work within our area. The Y&H AHSN is one of 15 networks across the country. By bringing together industry, academia, voluntary organisations and the NHS, AHSNs close the gap between innovation and patient benefit. As a network of networks they are able to actively share transformative innovation and take the lead in ensuring the “best buys” are spread nationwide. The Executive Group agreed to work with Y&H AHSN to develop a work programme to ensure that people in Humber, Coast and Vale get the benefit of spread of nationally funded programmes and to support delivery of local programmes agreed as priority areas of work across Humber, Coast and Vale.

### **Clinical Priority Programmes – Strategic Elective Network**

Across the wider Humber, Coast and Vale geography, our collaborative efforts are also focused upon work in six key clinical priority areas:

- Mental health
- Cancer
- Elective (planned) care
- Urgent and emergency care

- Maternity services
- Primary care

Working together to improve planned care locally is a key priority for the Partnership. In order to support our efforts to share learning and maximise the impact of transformation programmes, a Strategic Elective Network has been established. This network provides an opportunity for partners to update others on some of the initiatives and programmes taking place around Humber, Coast and Vale to transform elective (planned) care. At the first meeting of the Strategic Elective Network, partners discussed work on cardiology that has been taking place across the Partnership, which will be presented to the Cardiology Network at their meeting on 12 June. The Network also heard an update about the national diabetes programme in Humber, Coast and Vale and agreed to support a bid to trial new digital approaches to supporting people with type 2 diabetes to take a more active role in managing their condition. The Network agreed a workplan for the coming year, acknowledging that there is a need to increase opportunities for shared learning across the Partnership.
