### Executive Group Overview

#### Partnership Long Term Plan

The Partnership Executive Group reviewed the draft Partnership Long Term Plan, which had been submitted to NHS England/Improvement on 27<sup>th</sup> September 2019. Executive Group members reviewed the narrative and provided comments and suggestions to strengthen the document. The Executive Group confirmed that their priority was on ensuring local ownership of the plan and maintaining a focus on outcomes. The final version of the Partnership Long Term Plan will be submitted to NHS England/Improvement on 15<sup>th</sup> November 2019. #### Cancer Alliance Update

A new Senior Responsible Officer (SRO) to lead the Cancer Alliance has been agreed by the Partnership. Phil Mettam, Accountable Officer for Vale of York Clinical Commissioning Group, has now taken up the role leading the Cancer Alliance. Phil takes on the role from Jane Hawcard, who has now left East Riding of Yorkshire CCG to take up a new role as Chief Finance Officer for the North Yorkshire CCGs.

In updating the Executive Group on the work of the Cancer Alliance it was noted that the expectations on Cancer Alliances from national teams in NHS England/Improvement have grown, with a requirement to consider operational and performance issues alongside service transformation and broader strategic issues. Our Cancer Alliance in Humber, Coast and Vale has evolved and will continue to evolve to respond to changing expectations as well as responding to pressing local needs. Over the coming months and years, the Cancer Alliance will be undertaking work with partner organisations to review and agree strategic principles regarding the future configuration and delivery of cancer services in the region. ## Other News from the Partnership

### ICS Accelerator Programme

At the October meeting, the Partnership officially launched the ICS Accelerator Programme for Humber, Coast and Vale. The Accelerator Programme is an intensive programme of hands-on support, facilitation and shared learning that supports local Partnerships to develop and achieve Integrated Care System (ICS) status. The programme is structured around the key facets of system development as set out in the ICS maturity matrix, which is a tool used by the system development team within NHS England/Improvement to support local Partnerships to measure the level of maturity of their relationships and collaborative working arrangements.

Within Humber, Coast and Vale the Accelerator Programme will focus on four key areas of development, which were identified by local system leaders earlier this year. These areas are:

- Collective Partnership Working
- System Operating Arrangements
- Health and Social Care Professional Engagement
- Population Health Management

The programme will continue for around 19 weeks and formally end on 31<sup>st</sup> January 2019.
